The group acknowledged that County Ditch No. 11 was established by Order in 1905 and the construction plans for State Highway 30 were from 1931. There is no record of an agreement between MnDot and the Ditch Authority for the highway to be constructed over the established county tile.

The Drainage Authority's position is that the landowners should be responsible for what it would have cost to replace the tile as a typical farm drainage repair if a road had not been built over the top of it (less than \$10,000). They felt MnDOT should be responsible for the rest of the costs. They asked the representatives from MnDOT to take this back to their agency and respond with their position.

The Board briefly discussed the timing of when to abandon the old tile line. Kurt Deter will obtain the necessary data from Howard Konkol to prepare the abandonment petition. The landowners will be notified and a hearing will be held at a future meeting.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 1:53 p.m.
